Collect	An RSCM Collect or Trinity 1. E.g. God of majesty, whom saints and angels delight to worship in heaven: be with your servants who make music with your people, that, with joy, we on earth may glimpse your beauty; and bring us to the fulfilment of that hope of perfection, which will be ours as we stand before your unveiled glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord. <b>Amen.</b>	See RSCM Toolkit	Officiant
