Good stewards or bad tenants – Responding to the climate crisis

Extract from a liturgy published in "Dancers and Wayfarers" by Canterbury Press

The language about what is happening to our climate and worldwide environment is becoming ever more serious. We have moved from 'climate change', to 'climate crisis', and sometimes 'climate catastrophe'. Many have denied the science over the years, but now it is recognized as incontrovertible. Human beings have so damaged the environment that we are in danger of making our world uninhabitable. As Christians, we have resources to help us to respond to this crisis. We have an understanding of our relationship with creation and the Creator that can help us to change, that can be 'good news' for our world. But we are slow to hear and slow to respond. These resources are offered as an encouragement to action.

Opening Prayer

Creator God, you breathe life into all life, you hold the fragile balance of nature, you call us to be good stewards of creation, to honour you in the way we care for our world: but we have abused your trust, we have taken what we want, without heed of the consequences, we have wasted and discarded, without thought for the future. Open our hearts and minds to the signs of our times, to the groaning of creation, so that we turn. from being bad tenants to being good stewards of your world, in Jesus' name we pray.

Prayers of Intercession

We pray for the farming community, and all who produce food, that they may find ways of working more sustainably, to protect the soil and to reduce pollution. (Silence)

We wait with eager longing, We are your children.

We pray for scientists and engineers, all who research and discover, that they might equip us with means to protect our planet, to undo the damage we have done. (Silence)

We wait with eager longing, We are your children.

We pray for friends and neighbours and our local community, that we might find ways of working together to reduce waste, to protect habitat and to act locally. (Silence)

We wait with eager longing, We are your children.

We pray for all who are already suffering from the effects of climate change, for those experiencing extreme weather, rising sea levels, and economic deprivation. (Silence)

We wait with eager longing, We are your children.

We wait with eager longing for the glory that is to come. Where we have been bad tenants, help us to mend our ways. May we use all our ability to become good stewards of creation. **Amen.**

Action

Create ten prayer points in church and set up a focus for prayer and action at each one. These are based on ten actions we can take to respond to climate change.

- 1 Powering your home with 'green energy'
- 2 Eating less meat
- 3 Divesting your money from fossil fuels
- 4 Swapping clothes instead of buying new clothes
- 5 Switching to electric powered transport
- 6 Avoiding single use plastic bags and packaging
- Writing to your local council and MP to call attention to climate change
- 8 Buying local seasonal food
- 9 Growing your own food
- 10 Other suggestions!

You may like to set up a picture to illustrate the suggested action, with some explanation of why it would be good. Also, provide a pile of post-it notes and pens, for people to use to write their own commitment to change. These can then be added to a board in each location to show people's responses.

Act of Commitment

We stand to affirm our commitment to be good stewards together.

When you enter the land I am going to give you,
the land itself must observe a Sabbath to the LORD. Leviticus 25.2

We commit ourselves to embrace the changes needed in our lives. Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare. *Jeremiah* 29.7

We commit ourselves to undo the harm we have caused. Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in. *Isaiah* 58.12
